YFP OFFERINGS

YFP Book Club: Led by Mike White of Brighton Best International, we are proud to continue our book club. We host two book club meetings a year, highlighting books that fall under the umbrella of leadership and self-development. The first book club of the year is usually held in-person at the NFDA Annual Meeting & ESPS, and the second is held virtually in the Fall. The meetings include interactive conversations, where participants can share what they have taken away from the book and gain new insights from other readers in our industry!

FTI Partnership: The Fastener Training Institute has been instrumental in helping YFP achieve its goal of providing educational opportunities to new and existing members.
