Tami Compton, human resource manager at Mid-State, said Somers was greeted with great enthusiasm by the employees, who volunteered their time after work Friday to fill the backpacks and load them up on a truck for delivery to the church in Detroit.

"I am proud of our employees for stepping up and trying to help in any way they can," said Somers.

The employees packed 320 backpacks, containing necessities such as toiletries, female hygiene products, cold medicine, sanitary wipes, sunblock, socks, underwear and so on.

Compton said they also continue to raise
